











Multinational CMEs in early 1990's




Example of Multinational CMEs in early 2010's









OIL RECOVERY CO-OPERATION

Through the Convention on the Protection of the Marine Environment of the Baltic Sea Area, governed by HELCOM, Baltic coastal states have committed to cooperate to effectively respond to any oil spills by collecting the oil with vessels specially equipped for this purpose. The Convention limits the use of dispersants.






