GENERAL INFORMATION

The Advisory Board for Defence Information (ABDI) acts as a parliamentary forum that organises dialogue on security policy, homeland defence and preparedness for crises and emergencies among civil society organisations, decision-makers, authorities, the media and specialists. The ABDI monitors general preparedness for crises and emergencies in society and studies the related needs with a special focus on communications.

It helps civil society organisations and the media to develop their expertise and competence in security policy, homeland defence and preparedness. The ABDI surveys public attitudes towards security policy, homeland defence and general crisis awareness. It also pursues close cooperation at the Nordic level, especially with partners in Norway and Sweden.

ABDI IN 2024

Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, which started in February 2022, has had a fundamental impact on Finland's foreign and security policy and security environment. Destabilising activities around the world and in Finland's neighbouring areas have become mainstream. It was two years in the spring of 2024 since Finland acceded to NATO.

The Government appoint the ABDI for the parliamentary term on 7 September 2023. The ABDI is chaired by Member of Parliament (MP) *Jarno Limnell* (National Coalition Party), while Parliamentary Assistant *Marika Sorja* (Finns Party) and MP *Tuula Väättäinen* (Social Democratic Party of Finland) serve as Vice-Chairs.

The COVID-19 pandemic continued to have an impact on the implementation of the ABDI's annual survey. As was done already in 2020, the 2024 survey combined personal interviews and an internet panel. Before 2020, only personal interviews were used. The results of surveys conducted in a parliamentary election year are, as a rule, published at the start of the year following the elections. This means that two surveys were published in 2024: the 2023 survey and the 2024 survey.

Besides a Work Branch, the ABDI has an Education and Organisation Branch, a Media Branch and a Research Branch.

Since early 2020, following the coronavirus pandemic, the ABDI has been using the 'hybrid work model' in most of its activities so that people have been able to attend meetings and events either in person or remotely. Another benefit of hybrid working is that the ABDI's target groups working and/or living abroad are able to participate in the ABDI's events from abroad. It has also transformed the ABDI's activities so that remote work has become a well-established alternative to office work for the secretariat.

A particularly significant change for the ABDI and its Office was that *Heli Santala*, the ABDI's long-serving secretary general, transitioned into the 'reserves' in late March 2024.

SEMINARS AND PUBLIC EVENTS

The ABDI organised the following events in 2024:

Open public event in Seinäjoki on 10 June 2024

The ABDI organised a public event on foreign and security policy and homeland defence in the city council chamber at Seinäjoki City Hall on 10 June 2024. The event was streamed live.

The ABDI's acting Secretary-General *Markus Kinkku* opened the event, followed by *Paula Risikko* (National Coalition Party), Deputy Speaker of Parliament and the chair of the Seinäjoki City Executive, on behalf of the City of Seinäjoki. Brigadier General *Jami Virta*, Commander of the Pori Brigade, gave the keynote address.

After the opening speeches, a panel discussed foreign and security policy and homeland defence. The panellists were MP *Paula Risikko* (National Coalition Party), MP *Juha Mäenpää* (Finns Party), MP *Jani Kokko* (Social Democratic Party of Finland), MP *Mikko Savola* (Centre Party), Chair of the City Council Group *Aki Ruotsala* (Christian Democrats in Finland) and Chair of the Ostrobothnia District Organisation of the Swedish People's Party of Finland *Samuel Broman*. *Markku Mantila*, Editor-in-Chief of the newspaper *Ilkka-Pohjalainen*, moderated the panel discussion and gave the closing words.

Around 75 people attended the event in person, and 51 people watched the live stream. All in all, around 125 people attended the event either in person or remotely.

Open public event in Kajaani on 26 August 2024

The ABDI organised a public event on foreign and security policy and homeland defence in the city council chamber at Kajaani City Hall on 26 August 2024. The event was streamed live.

The ABDI's Chair *Jarno Limnéll* (National Coalition Party) opened the event, followed by Chief Executive *Jari Tolonen* on behalf of the City of Kajaani. There were two keynote addresses. The first was delivered by *Matti Sarén*, President of Kajaani University of Applied Sciences and the second by Colonel *Tuomas Laosmaa*, Commander of Kainuu Border Guard District.

After the opening speeches, a panel discussed foreign and security policy and homeland defence. The panellists were MP *Mikko Polvinen* (Finns Party), MP *Tuomas Kettunen* (Centre Party), Member of the European Parliament *Merja Kyllönen* (Left Alliance), First Deputy Chair of Kajaani City Executive *Eero Suutari* (National Coalition Party), Second Deputy Chair of Kuhmo City Council *Riikka Seppänen* (Social Democratic Party of Finland) and Council Councillor and Regional Assembly Member of North Ostrobothnia *Mika Flöjt* (Greens). The panel discussion was moderated by *Vilja Sorsa*, Digital Producer at the *Kainuu Sanomat* newspaper.

The closing words were given by MP *Mikko Polvinen*, Chair of the ABDI's Education and Organisation Branch.

Around 90 people attended the event in person, and at its peak 114 people watched the live stream at the same time. All in all, at least 204 people attended the event either in person or remotely.

Before the event, the ABDI's delegation visited Kainuu Brigade. The delegation learned the brigade's latest news and followed the Readiness Unit's training in the training area. The visit was hosted by Brigadier General *Ari Laaksonen*, Brigade Commander, Lieutenant Colonel *Jukka Vuorisalmi*, Chief of Staff, and Sergeant First Class *Jarno Mikkola*. The ABDI delegation included MP *Jarno Limnéll*, Chair, MP *Mikko Polvinen*, Chair of the Education and Organisation Branch, *Harriet Lonka*, Member of the Work Branch, *Petri Savolainen*, Member, *Markus Kinkku*, acting Secretary General, and *Laura Renvall*, Administrative Assistant.

Seminar for journalists in Helsinki on 17 December 2024

The ABDI organised its annual foreign and security policy seminar for journalists in the Ostrobothnia hall in Helsinki on 17 December 2024. The event was streamed live.

MP *Jarno Limnell*, Chair of the ABDI, opened the seminar, and Minister of Defence *Antti Häkkinen* gave a keynote address on topical foreign and security policy matters. Permanent State Under-Secretary *Outi Holopainen* from the Ministry for Foreign Affairs talked about Finland's foreign and security policy, and Major General *Sami Nurmi*, Deputy Chief of Staff for Strategy from the Finnish Defence Forces, discussed Finland's NATO membership from the perspective of the Finnish Defence Forces.

Rear Admiral *Markku Hassinen*, Deputy Chief of the Finnish Border Guard, described current affairs at the Finnish Border Guard, and *Tarja Fernández*, Ambassador of Finland in Kyiv, brought greetings from Ukraine.

Juha Martelius, Director of the Finnish Security Intelligence Service, spoke about how the instability of the global security environment is challenging Finland, and Brigadier General *Pekka Turunen* gave an account of the current affairs in the field of military intelligence.

Heli Simola, Senior Economist at the Bank of Finland Institute for Emerging Economies, talked about the economic outlook for Russia and Ukraine, and *Benita Heiskanen*, Professor at the University of Turku, discussed the aftermath of the US presidential elections. The last keynote speaker was *Hannu Juusola*, Professor at the University of Helsinki, who spoke about the situation in the Middle East.

The ABDI's Secretary General *Markus Kinkku* gave the closing words of the seminar.

About 160 people attended the seminar in person at the Ostrobothnia hall, and 117 people watched the live stream. All in all, around 204 people attended the seminar either in person or remotely.

The ABDI requests feedback from all event participants, and, for a long time, the response has been that overall the ABDI's events are well-organised and have interesting themes.

The ABDI's open public events are open to everyone, while the seminars are by invitation only.

ABDI SURVEY

Each year, the ABDI conducts an extensive survey, comprising the entire population, to investigate the opinions and attitudes of Finns towards security policy and the factors influencing them.

The results of surveys conducted in a parliamentary election year are, as a rule, published at the start of the year following the elections. This means that two surveys were published in 2024: the 2023 survey and the 2024 survey.

The ABDI commissioned the 2023 and 2024 surveys from Taloustutkimus Oy. The 2023 and 2024 surveys combined personal interviews and an internet panel, following the pattern of the 2020 survey. Previous surveys had only personal interviews.

The 2023 survey included a total of 21 questions, two of which were new. The interviews took place between 8 November and 26 November 2023, and the panel results were collected between 15 November and 28 November 2023. The sample was 1,197 people, and the target group was Finland's population between the ages of 15 and 79, not including Åland.

The results of the 2023 survey were revealed in the Ostrobothnia Hall on 19 January 2024. The event was also available for remote participation. The ABDI's Chair, *Jarno Limnéll*, opened the event. Secretary General *Heli Santala* presented the survey results, followed by comments from *Riku Keski-Rauska*, Chair of the ABDI's Research Branch. *Tuomo Turja*, Research Director at Taloustutkimus Oy, was also present to answer questions.

The 2024 survey included a total of 21 questions. The interviews took place between 12 September and 6 October 2024, and the panel results were collected between 17 September and 7 October 2024. The sample was 1,112 people, and the target group was Finland's population between the ages of 15 and 79, not including Åland.

The results of the 2024 survey were revealed in the Topelius meeting room at Ostrobothnia on 4 December 2024. The event was also available for remote participation. The ABDI's Chair, *Jarno Limnéll*, opened the event. Secretary General *Markus Kinkku* presented the survey results, followed by comments from *Riku Keski-Rauska*, Chair of the ABDI's Research Branch. *Tuomo Turja*, Research Director at Taloustutkimus Oy, was also present to answer questions.

The survey reports published by the ABDI are in the public domain and accessible to all. When citing or using the results, always mention the relevant ABDI survey as the source.

NORDIC COOPERATION

The ABDI works closely with its sister organisations in other Nordic countries and especially with *Folk och Försvar* in Sweden and *Folk og Forsvar* in Norway.

Each year, the three organisations organise a Nordic conference on a rotating basis. A Teams meeting to plan the next conference was held on 1 February 2024. Secretary General *Heli Santala* and Assistant Secretary General *Markus Kinkku* attended the meeting for the ABDI.

The 2024 conference was held in Linköping, Sweden, between 13 and 15 May 2024. Its theme was the common defence of the Nordic countries.

The first day of the conference, 13 May 2024, was held at the Saab main office.

The conference was opened by *Maud Holma von Heijne*, Secretary General of *Folk och Försvar*.

After the opening address, Saab directors *Carl-Henrik Arvidsson*, *Johan Rättvall* and *Ulf Hellberg* described operations at Saab.

The opening address was followed by a guided tour of the Saab main office.

Next in the programme were:

- Presentation by *Lars Helmrich*, Director of the Swedish Defence Materiel Administration, on the future of the Swedish Air force
- Presentation by *Fredrik Hassel*, Senior Advisor at Saab, on defence industry as a geopolitical question
- Panel discussion on common Nordic defence, moderated by *David Bruhn*, Programme Manager at *Folk och Försvar*. The panellists were:
 - *Asle Strand*, Norway's Liaison Officer to the Swedish Armed Forces
 - *Juha Kilpi*, Finland's Defence Attaché to Sweden
 - *Ken Nielsen*, Denmark's Liaison Officer to the Swedish Armed Forces
 - *Per Edling*, Assistant Chief of Staff Operations at the Swedish Joint Force Command.

The next day of the conference, 14 May 2024, was held at the Swedish Defence Research Agency (FOI).

Head of Division *Linda Sjödin* presented the agency's activities. Next followed presentations on a range of topics, including cybersecurity, artificial intelligence and technology manipulation. Presentations were given by Researcher *Lars Norin*, Researcher *Paulina Ärlebäck*, Head of Division *Jonas Hallberg* and Researcher *Niclas Wadströmer*.

Next in the programme were:

- Presentation by *Jimmy Ahlstrand*, Chief Corporate Affairs and Strategy Officer at Telenor Sweden, on integrated digital safety
- Presentation by *Stefan Gustafsson*, Senior Vice President at the Swedish Space Corporation, on satellites and space infrastructure
- Presentation by *Anders Kämpe*, Manager at Seaway7, on piracy as a threat to merchant shipping
- Presentation by *Sune Lund*, Commander in the Royal Danish Navy, on a maritime joint operation in the Red Sea.

The day was concluded with a visit to the Swedish Air Force Museum.

The third day of the conference, 15 May 2024, was held at the Linköping Castle and Cathedral Museum.

The day's programme included:

- Presentation by *Christina Andersson*, Risk Communication Strategist at the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency (MSB) and *Henrik P. Framvig*, Journalist and Board Member of the Danish sister organisation *Folk og Sikkerhed*, on communicating about preparedness

- Presentation by Professor *Magnus Karlsson*, Head of Center for Civil Society Research at Marie Cederschiöld University, on what can be expected of society in times of crisis
- *Pirjo Auvinen*, Nordic correspondent at the Finnish Broadcasting Company, and *Heidi Avellan*, Editor-in-Chief of the *HD-Sydsvenskan* newspaper, on how we talk about war and defence.

The ABDI delegation at the 2024 Nordic conference included the ABDI's Vice-Chair, MP *Tuula Väättäinen*, members of the Work Branch *Matti Heikkinen*, *Johanna Kelhu*, *Harriet Lonka*, *Timo Perälä* and *Mikko Polvinen*, acting Secretary General *Markus Kinkku* and *Pirjo Auvinen*, the Nordic correspondent at the Finnish Broadcasting Company.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Work Branch's visit to Brussels

The ABDI's Work Branch visited Brussels from 14 to 16 March 2024. They visited the NATO Headquarters, the Permanent Representation of Finland to NATO and the Permanent Representation of Finland to the European Union.

In Brussels, the Work Branch had meetings with *Piritta Asunmaa*, Permanent Representative of Finland to NATO, Lieutenant General *Kim Jäämeri*, Finland's Military Representative to the EU and NATO, *Pete Piirainen*, Senior Specialist in the Defence Team, *Ville-Veikko Pitkänen*, Senior Specialist in the Resilience Committee, *Amy Lecomber* and *Beatriz Molina Sanchez*, Researchers at NATO's Public Diplomacy Division, *Markku Keinänen*, Head of Mission at the Permanent Representation of Finland to the EU, *Juha Ottman*, Ambassador to the EU Political and Security Committee, and *Ville Similä* and *Anna Oksanen*, Senior Specialists at the Permanent Representation of Finland to the EU. The Work Branch was even able to have an impromptu meeting with NATO Secretary General *Jens Stoltenberg*.

National Defence Courses

Each year, the ABDI proposes a list of the journalists and representatives of science it would like to see invited to join the National Defence Courses. The list of invitees is confirmed by the Delegation of National Defence Education. The ABDI was represented in the delegation by Chair *Jarno Limnéll* as a full member and, until 31 March 2024, Secretary General *Heli Santala* as deputy member. Acting Secretary General (later Secretary General) *Markus Kinkku* became a deputy member on 1 April 2024.

Basic communications course

The ABDI recruits journalists and communications specialists who have not done military service to a basic communications course, organised annually by the Public Information Division of the Defence Command Finland. The 55th course was held at the Defence Command Finland and the Coastal Brigade in Upinniemi, Kirkkonummi, from 7 to 10 October 2024. Altogether 25 ABDI-

recruited journalists and communications specialists, who have not done military service, attended the course.

ABDI website and social media

The ABDI has its own site at the website of the Ministry of Defence www.defmin.fi/mts. The website has information about the ABDI, its activities and its seminars and events, including photos and recordings. The ABDI site, including its language versions, was visited a total of 3,615 times in 2024. Survey reports were downloaded from the Institutional Repository for the Government (Valto) and from the ABDI site, language versions included, altogether 3,160 times.

The ABDI has had a Twitter (now X) account, *@MTS_Suomi*, since the end of December 2015. The ABDI uses the account especially to communicate about its events and surveys but also to distribute other information on foreign and security policy and homeland defence. The same applies to the ABDI's LinkedIn profile, which it created in 2024.

Branches and meetings

In 2024, the ABDI had a Work Branch, an Education and Organisation Branch, a Media Branch and a Research Branch.

The Plenum, or general meeting, convened once in 2024. The Work Branch met five times, the Research Branch four times, the Media Branch twice and the Education and Organisation Branch once. A total of 13 meetings were held during the year.

Teuvo Arolainen, Preparedness Specialist at the National Emergency Supply Agency, specialist of the Media Branch, gave a presentation on a report discussing the continuity of the Ukrainian media during the war at the Media Branch meeting, held in Topelius meeting room at Ostrobothnia on 1 October 2024.

The branch meetings prepared the ABDI's activities. The Research Branch followed other opinion polls on foreign and security policy and national defence carried out Finland, Sweden, Norway and NATO.

Finances of the ABDI

In 2024, the ABDI was allocated an operating appropriation of EUR 117,000, of which it used EUR 108,241.09 (92.5%).

Secretariat and Office of the ABDI

The ABDI operates under the auspices of the Ministry of Defence and as part of the Media and Communications Unit.

The ABDI has a Secretary General and an Assistant Secretary General. Until 31 March 2024, the Secretary General was *Heli Santala*, M.Soc.Sc. *Markus Kinkku*, M.Soc.Sc., served as acting Secretary General as of 1 April 2024 until his appointment as Secretary General on 1 September 2024.

Markus Kinkku, M.Soc.Sc., served as Assistant Secretary General until 31 March.

Laura Renvall, M.Soc.Sc., M.A. (Mus.), was appointed the ABDI's Administrative Assistant on 6 May 2024.
